Her family was friendly with the Frank family and Eva grew up with Ann Frank. After the War, Eva's mother and Ann Frank's father married .

We are truly honoured every time Eva visits us and her message of tolerance and peace is as true today as it was in the 1930s.

Reading Skills: tips for parents

Our progress score for reading this summer was 4.02, which is defined as 'well above average'. This means children in our Year 6 made better progress in four years than most other children of similar ability across England and wales.

Many parents believe that reading skills are the skills to 'sound-out' print on a page, but there is much more to it. Among the more complex reading skills are making inferences and prediction, retrieval of information and use of linguistic style.

Children of all ages should be reading and sharing books at home with parents and carers (though this will look very different for different ages).

On our website we have put sets of questions that can be used to develop children's comprehension skills. They have also been sent out through parent mail. Take time to look at them and do use them with your children
