



Puzzle Corner

This week's puzzle comes from India and is over **1,500 years** old!

A merchant pays duty (tax) on certain goods at three different places. At the first he gives 1/3 of his goods as duty/ At the second place he gives 1/4 of what he has left and at the third, 1/5 of the remainder. Altogether he paid a duty equivalent to 24 coins. What were his goods originally worth?

You may be interested to know that the mathematician who set this question, **Aryabhatta** (476–550 <u>CE</u>), calculated the value of pi to 3.1416 and the length of a solar year to 365.3586805.
