

#### Laudato si'

As part of our commitment to the Pope's encyclical, Laudato si', we will from time to time share practical tips to help families reduce waste. This week we have information about using real nappies, sent to us by Plasticfree East Dulwich (plasticfreeeastdulwich.org).

Using real nappies for your baby can help reduce your household waste by nearly half. It can also save you up to £500 per child. Southwark Council do a starter pack you can apply for (southwark.gov.uk) and there's a monthly nanny clinic as part of Takes A Village at Aneto Cafe on East Dulwich Road.
