Despite the poor weather, Year 2 children travelled to London Bridge today to visit the Monument to the Great Fire of London (better known as "the Monument"). This structure was designed by Sir Christopher Wren and is nearly 350 years old.

Interesting fact: The inscription at the foot of the Monument originally blamed Catholics for the Great Fire! (Fortunately, the words of blame were removed in 1830.)



### Safeguarding: Anti-Bullying Week



This week the school has had a special focus on addressing bullying behaviour. There have been dedicated lessons every day (including odd socks day on Tuesday) for children and adults to consider ways we can

make St Anthony's an even safer place for everyone. The motto for the week was 'change starts with us'.





Children across the school have been learning about Judaism this week. In the above photo Year 4 children are learning from Pat, a local resident and regular reader at St Anthony's. Pat talked about the Torah (first 5 books of the Bible) and the coming of age rites of bar mitzvah and bat mitzvah. She brought several artefacts for the children to see such as candlesticks made by her great uncle (later a victim of the Holocaust) and kippahs (skullcaps) for the children to wear.
