From a letter received from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP; based on pupil progress in reading, writing and maths from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6.

This week we were able to open up our second Y1 hub for 15 children. It was lovely to see more of our community return to our site but we are conscious that the majority are still learning at home. While the locations might be different, the materials for learning are the same and we received warm praise this week from a parent who passed on a comment from an external educator, who works with children from many schools: **"[St Anthony's] home learning resources have been by far the best that I've seen of all the different primary schools in the area."**

Next week, we will be opening two Year 2 hubs, which will mean revised scheduling for outdoor spaces and lunch provision. We will continue to risk assess and keep you informed regarding the opening of more hubs.

Parents are often referred to as a child's first educators and we continue to appreciate all that parents are doing during this time. Whether it be sharing time and resources at home to deliver lessons or making extra efforts to collect their children in good time at the end of the day, to allow staff to leave the premises promptly, we recognise that this is not always easy.

This Sunday is Fathers' Day and children have been making cards to say thanks to the people who look after them. To all parents and carers, from St Anthony's, a big thank you.

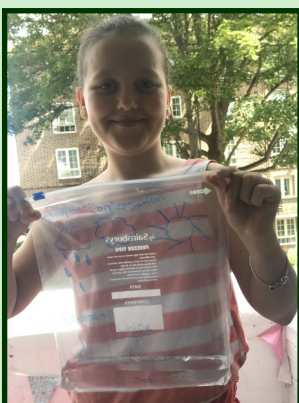
