From a letter received from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP; based on pupil progress in reading, writing and maths from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6.

This week we welcomed two new hubs of Year 2 children, meaning we now have eleven hubs in operation. Next week we will be taking in two more for Year 5 children. These hubs have a slightly later start time and a slightly earlier finish to avoid congestion. If you have more than one child in school and one of them is in Year 2 or Year 5 then these times apply to all of your children.

On **Wednesdays**, school closes at 12 noon. Children in Years 2 and 5 (and their siblings) are to be collected from the small gate on **Friern Road**.

We hosted our first webinar this week for parents of children starting Reception in September. It worked well and parents received all the information they need and met key members of staff who appeared as panellists on the webinar. A grateful parent sent us some lovely feedback: It was helpful and reassuring. We were so impressed at how you are dealing with the current situation.

There will be a general webinar for parents next Tuesday, with information about the final weeks of this term and our plans for September.

Thank you for your continued understanding and support at this time. As ever, the work done by our families is vital to keeping our school community together.
