From a letter received from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP; based on pupil progress in reading, writing and maths from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6.

This week we welcomed our Reception children to St Julie's and St Joseph's Classes. Each class operates as its own bubble, with the children and staff remaining only within their bubble but still able to access all the facilities early years children need, including outdoor spaces.

Everyone in school has been very good at remembering to follow the Covid arrangements of social distancing outside bubbles and regular handwashing and wiping down of surfaces.

Drop off and collection is now a smooth operation but we must remind parents that children waiting with their siblings are a <u>family bubble</u> and they are to <u>keep a 2 metre</u> <u>distance from children in their class bubble</u>.

We also held our 'Meet the Teacher' webinars for parents this week. These were very well received and we wil continue to reach out to parents through webinars this term.

This Sunday is **Education Sunday**, a special day of prayer for all people involved in any aspect of education. The theme for this year is "A learning people in a time of change". We are immensely thankful to all people who have supported young people with their education this year, including families who enabled all the home-learning during lockdown.

Mass attendance & Admissions during Covid19

On the advice of the Education Commission of the Archdiocese of Southwark, the governing body of St Anthony's has agreed the following statement.

The suspension of the obligation to attend Sunday Mass was announced on 18th March 2020 by the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales. If a parent/carer attended Mass at particular parish (or parishes) prior to 18th March 2020 then they will be considered to have attended Mass in that parish (or parishes) regularly since that time. This will remain the case until the Sunday obligation is reintroduced by the Bishops.

This statement has been shared widely with parishes in order to ensure that determinations made by parish priests concerning regular practice of the faith are being made on a consistent basis.

Open Sessions at Notre Dame


