From a letter received from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP; based on pupil progress in reading, writing and maths from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6.

Please note that younger children currently receive a new reading book on a Monday and are expected to return it to school on a Thursday.












Faith Life
