From a letter received from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP; based on pupil progress in reading, writing and maths from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6.

Dear Parents and Carers,

As the weather is now getting a little colder, I would advise you to ensure that children wear an additional layer beneath their school uniform. These can be base layers or thermals — particularly if your child has a tendency to feel the cold.

Schools and other work places are only able to remain open providing we have a constant source of ventilation; so we are required to keep windows in classrooms and offices open throughout the day. We do ensure that the heating remains on and, despite the colder weather, are often reminding children (of all ages) to put on coats when going outside.

This is very similar to the conditions that we have always had in Reception and Nursery, where we operate a free flow (open door) approach for Early Years.

We have to follow very strict guidance and we are doing all that we can to ensure that we remain open for the children in our school. We continue to work closely with a Health and Safety consultant to minimise the risks for everyone.

At present, our overall school attendance for this year is very strong and is higher than it was at this time last year. In fact, this week our attendance has been 99% whereas last year it was 97.6%.

Obviously, we are all looking forward to a time when we can return to normal but in the meantime we are actively doing all that we can to ensure we meet the strict guidelines that we must to adhere to.

We are incredibly grateful to you for your continued support.

The Nuffield Early Language Intervention (NELI) programme is part of an initiative funded by the Department for Education in response to Covid-19. We have been granted access to the programme and will be employing an individual who will be trained to deliver the programme to children in the Reception Year.

The 20 week NELI programme aims to develop children's vocabulary, listening and narrative skills and in the last 10 weeks also involves work to develop phonological awareness and early letter-sound knowledge as foundations for early literacy.






Faith Life
