From a letter received from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP; based on pupil progress in reading, writing and maths from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6.

This week is Children's Mental Health Week, a timely reminder that we should all look after our mental well being. Children have been learning the importance of selfexpression and the many ways this can be done (through drawing, painting, music or poetry, to name a few). While we are all appreciative of the benefits brought about by innovations in technology, such as Google Classroom, it is also good for mental health to limit the amount of time we spend behind a screen and take regular breaks. Organisations, such as Parentzone, offer plenty of free advice to parents about managing screen time.

Put on plenty of layers and go outside to notice nature in all its splendour (there is plenty of evidence to suggest that noticing nature is very good for our mental health). There is a three-digit number; the second digit is four times as big as the third digit, while the first digit is three less than the second digit. What is the number?


