From a letter received from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP; based on pupil progress in reading, writing and maths from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6.

Attendance since we returned after the last lockdown has been exceptionally good, at 98.2%. This means that our children have been able to make the most of returning to school and all its associated benefits (not least the social and emotional aspects of being back with one's peers).

The beginning and end of the day continues to run very smoothly but we are conscious that it would be better if the start and end times could be the same for everyone. We will therefore start this in the week beginning 10 May, when we will allow Y1 and Y2 parents back on site to collect their children. More details of how this will work safely will follow soon.

Parents are keen to have our streets as a safe as possible and some have contacted Southwark Highways about this. Etherow St is a busy thoroughfare because of the buses but there may be measures the council can put in place, so you may wish to contact them directly to encourage this.

Remember Monday is a bank holiday, so school will be closed.

## Stephen Lawrence

Stephen Lawrence was born the 13<sup>th</sup> of September 1974 and died the 22nd of April 1993.

He was a black British teenager from Plumstead in Southeast London, who was murdered in a racially motivated attack while waiting for a bus in Well Hall, on the evening of the 22<sup>nd</sup> April 1993. His murder led to the partial revocation of the rule against double jeopardy. Two of the perpetrators were convicted of murder in 2012. After the initial investigation, five suspects were arrested but not charged. It was suggested during the investigation that Lawrence was killed because he was black. He died when he was 18 years

old. His father was Neville Lawrence who was a carpenter and he is Jamaican. His mother was Doreen Lawrence and she was a special needs teacher and is Jamaican like her husband.
