From a letter received from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP; based on pupil progress in reading, writing and maths from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6.

Parents of children in Years 1 and 2 are now collecting from the playground at the end of they day. This is now running smoothly and safely, with a swift one-way system and <u>mandatory face coverings</u>. For next week, we will keep the system as it is. There will be a Parentmail message sent out when we are able to allow more parents on site.

There is likely to be further easing of restrictions from the Government next week; however, parents are reminded to exercise caution when arranging playdates, etc. Avoid gathering indoors and still follow good hygiene practice (especially thorough handwashing). In school, we will continue with our current 'bubble' arrangements; this includes separate breaks and lunch arrangements. With a rise in cases of new, more aggressive coronavirus variants, we all have a social duty to keep each other safe.


May is the month of Mary!
