School Uniform

Pupils from Reception to Y6 should be wearing Winter Uniform this term: white shirt, school tie, school jumper, grey trousers/skirt, black shoes (not trainers). Hair bands/ribbons should be in the school colours of gold/green, earrings should be studs or sleepers and watches should be simple devices for telling the time (not smart watches).

During the cold weather, you are reminded that your child should bring a warm coat, hat and gloves for times when they are outside. We also recommend wearing a vest and thermal underwear as we keep the windows open for good ventilation.

PE kit should be brought to school on Monday and taken home on Friday to be washed.

All uniform and belongings are to be clearly marked with your child's name and class. Please check that this has not faded!

Lost property is kept in a covered box in the bike-park area near the school gate. Any unclaimed property will, eventually, be disposed of.


Faith Life
