



From a letter received from Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP; based on pupil progress in reading, writing and maths from the end of Year 2 to the end of Year 6.

The Queen herself expressed a wish that trees be planted to mark the celebration. We will be planting three silver birch trees and one oak in the school grounds next week and we hope that this will get a mention in the local press.

It can be from any point during her reign and can be made using any medium you wish. # **Faith Life**


